PLANTING, WATERING, & GROWTH

In 1 Corinthians 3, verses 6-9, the apostle Paul wrote these words: "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. He who plants and he who waters are one, and each will receive his wages according to his labor. For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building."

On July 4th, I met a long-time pastor friend at the Edenton fireworks. He and his wife were in town to celebrate it with his children and grandchildren. Pastor R. had been instrumental in bringing revitalization and vision to one of our Edenton churches years ago. During those years, we had many conversations about church and ministry, and he laid a very strong foundation for a church that really took off in growth when the next pastor came, and which is still growing and multiplying today. I liken his work at this church to what Paul is saying. Pastor R. was like Paul and perhaps Apollos – the important lesson is that it is God who gave the increase.

There are many spiritual lessons for us in this passage from 1 Corinthians 3. Paul was wise to give God all the glory. "God gave the growth. Only God gives the growth. You are God's building." As I have gotten older in life and ministry, I have a greater appreciation for church planters and those who do the hard work to get a church on a solid foundation. And I have equal appreciation to those who work to revitalize a church, who are willing to make the hard decisions to give the church a future. I also love this line from the apostle, "For we are God's fellow workers." We work together for the Kingdom, the Kingdom of God.
