THE BIRTH OF CHURCH PLANTING

The book of Acts is our source for understanding the birth of church planting. It took a number of forms. At Pentecost, people from different lands and languages heard the message of salvation in Jesus Christ. God used Simon Peter to preach boldly about Jesus, particularly His death and resurrection. We can be assured that when these new converts went back to their homes around the world that they also shared the message of Jesus as Messiah. Most of those early converts were Jewish, so for some the birth of Christianity had some tentative roots in the synagogues.

But the real birth of church planting happened when the Antioch church sent out Barnabas and Saul (Paul) to take the Gospel to the world. For the next 30 or so years, Barnabas, Paul, Silas, Timothy, Titus, Aquila and Priscilla, Apollos, John Mark and others effectively shared Christ and started churches. Quite a few of the New Testament books are named after those cities and churches. The basic strategy was to first preach Jesus as Messiah to the Jews. While some Jews converted to Christ, most did not. In fact, almost always these apostles/missionaries were told to leave, or were forced to leave. This led to them spending most of their time and resources with Gentiles. The result was that most of the earliest church participants were Gentile believers, totally new in their faith.

Finally, every new church plant was small. These believers met almost exclusively in people's homes. But there was an order to their devotion – breaking bread and having meals together, praying constantly, and ministering with and for each other. Because of the constant threat of persecution, standing together was not an option. The other thing we can say for sure is that these believers were fully engaged with society. Paul and his team shared Christ with the highest government leaders. They constantly battled religious opposition. And through it all they planted churches everywhere they went.
